Monday 10th March

For our March meeting we will be discussing An Island by Karen Jenkins which was longlisted for the 2021 Booker Prize. A young refugee washes up unconscious on the beach of a small island inhabited by no one but Samuel, an old lighthouse keeper. Unsettled, Samuel is soon swept up in memories of his former life on the mainland: a life that saw his country suffer, then fight for independence, only to fall to a cruel dictator; he recalls his own part in its history, spending 25 years in prison before finding the job looking after the lighthouse. Samuel's story is set over four days, switching between the present day and his past. With the arrival of the stranger, Samuel's home and place of safety, separated and distant from the mainland, is threatened.

It should lead to an interesting discussion to which new members are always welcome.
